



Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time τ

July 28, 2024



Dear Friends in Christ.

The Gospel of the Seventeenth Sunday leads us up on the mountain to witness another miracle through which our Lord feeds "about five thousand" men. What does this miracle tell us about? It is a foreshadow of the Eucharist which Jesus will institute at the Last Supper before He offers Himself for our salvation, so that we will continue to be fed by the Lord, not with bread and fish, but with His Body and Precious Blood, which will bring us to eternal life.

You and I are insistently invited by the Lord Himself to come to His Holy Banquet to be fed, nourished and become like the Lord in our words and actions.

Let us never stop praising and thanking God for the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. With faith we "see" our Lord in this sacrament; with love we are "touched" and we touch the Resurrected Lord.

May we always strive to prepare ourselves worthily, at least having no mortal sins in us, to receive our Lord into our "own house." If one realizes that there is mortal sin in him/her, one should reconcile with God and His Church first through the sacrament of Penance before receiving Holy Communion. It is better to not receive Jesus than to receive Him with mortal sin because one will commit another mortal sin!

Additionally, we will also fast one hour from eating, except water and medication, before we receive Holy Communion, and we will have a "good intention" for embracing Jesus into our soul.

Beside these, dressing modestly is another issue that we, as Catholics, do not really pay attention to. Maybe we do not have faith at all in the Real Presence of our Lord in the Eucharist; or we do not know what we are doing at Holy Mass or why we are at Mass. The Holy Mass, offered at the Holy Altar of God in Church - the House of Prayer, the Sacred Place - is the Holy Banquet of the Lord, the Divine Liturgy, and the Wedding Feast of the Lamb of God. The Holy Mass is NOT a show; the Church building is not a theater, a bar, a social hall.

By dressing inappropriately when we come to the Holy Banquet of the Lord, we place our Lord *below* the President, Governor, Mayor, or others in authority. In other words, God is less important than a human being (a human being is God's creature)!

May you and I have a true, sincere love and profound respect for the Lord - our Creator, particularly when we come to celebrate the Holy Eucharist where our redemption is renewed for us. Amen.
